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

They don't have to report DO so we only see it when we check during inspections. I think we asked for DO in the "new GP" but I's have to double check to be sure. Usually the DO in the pens is pretty close to the mixing zone, maybe 1 or 2 ppm off during the inspection. The DO is usually up close to saturation in the mixing zone and lower in the pens.

I'm concerned but I expect we are getting the real skinny.

Lobster pounds & lobster docks had this sort of problem in August and September.

High density of critters, nice green algae laden water, warm water, slack tide, and flat calm nights so the water isn't stirred up.

Once it gets dark and the plankton stop photosynthesizing and start using O2 the situation can get pretty bad.

I've heard of this in AQ classes back in the day and it's sort of what happens with the pogy kills that start to happen at this time of year.

It might be worth keeping note of this and considering the max pen loading in the new permit.

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



Hi Jennifer:

I'm adding a little more to my request for information.

Having maybe 100,00 fish die off overnight is a pretty serious event, environmentally speaking.

You told me that right now you think this was caused by low DO in the pens.

What is causing you to think that?

Please send me your mixing zone records for DO for all of July and August 2021.

From inspections I remember the feeding crew monitors the DO before feeding so that you can withhold feed when the DO gets too low.

I don't know if you keep that data for more than a week or 2 since that's all I remember looking at during inspections.

Do you keep that data on file?

If you do please send the DO in the pens for July & August.

Do you check the DO all day and at night or just around feeding time?

Have you had a big fish kill like this at any of the sites before? Either recently or a long time back?

Have the pen crews seen anything unusual out there?

Any troubles with or complaints from the neighbors out there?

Could you tell me a little more about when this happened?

Looking over my notes from your call, it looks like the crew found the fish dead this morning.

Did I get that correct?

If not, when did you find out you had so many dead fish?

Did anyone check the feed for mold or other contaminants? Are the fish on the same feed? Have any of the fish been biopsied yet to see if there might be a disease outbreak starting?

I may be back in touch with more questions but that is enough for now.

I'm going to want to get out to the Black Island sites pretty soon.
